Each meeting is full of numerical figures, profound decisions, and diligent contemplation on effectively managing the resources our church has been bestowed with by God.

As a committee, we continue to respond to the many needs of our properties. Our rental properties both continue to be in the hands of insurance companies. Please be praying for answers to our many unknowns, particularly in relation to timeframes, and that we would be patient as we wait for God's timing, particularly with 99 Brewster Street.

Our Park Ave building continues to be investigated as a possible insurance claim regarding the shade sails and interior leaking as a result of damage to the roof. The committee also approved the funding for the repair works to make the toilet block usable during wet weather again.

We spent time at our September meeting looking ahead and ensuring our compliance with future Human Resources and financial requirements. We also thanked God for his provision and the continued generosity of our church family.

Our budgeted weekly giving is \$9,344. As at 9 September 2023, weekly giving received had been an average of \$9292.99 per week. In total year to date, we are \$1836.39 behind budget. Please be praying for continued generosity and that our church would continue to reach the lost of Lismore and surrounds.
