# HOW TO BE GROWING FOLLOWERS OF JESUS AS YOU STUDY GOD'S WORD...

#### IN COMMUNITY



It's good to study the Bible by yourself but it's even better to do it with friends. Bible study is best when it happens in the context of community. Bible study shouldn't be just an unrelated add-on to the rest of your busy life, it should be an essential part of an integrated whole—Christian friends doing what Christian friends do. There are two key ways we should be making use of God's word in community: "word to life" and "life to word".

#### **WORD TO LIFE**



When we study the Bible together we're letting God set the agenda. That's very important! We listen to God speak in the Bible, we work hard to help each other understand exactly what he's saying, and then together we apply what God is saying to our lives in the confidence that our loving Creator and Redeemer knows what's best for us. The important thing to remember is that we actually need each other throughout this whole process. It's great to study the Bible together!

#### **LIFE TO WORD**



The second crucial way that we should be making use of the Bible in community is in day-to-day conversation, starting with the everyday happenings of our lives and applying the gospel to those situations. The great thing is that the better we get at moving from "word to life", the better we'll get at moving from "life to word" and the more our communities will be shaped by the gospel of Jesus! ### JOHN 14:1-14

- 1. Look back at John 13 (particularly vs 21-38). What things would have troubled the disciples during this time with Jesus?
- 2. What is amazingly comforting in Jesus' response to the troubled hearts of the disciples (14:1-4)?
- 3. What does the question from Thomas (v.5) and the statement from Philip (v.8) reveal about their hearts at this time?

4. What is wonderful and surprising about Jesus' response to Thomas' question?
5. How does Jesus respond to Philip's statement? And what could he be pointing to in verses 12-14 (look to 14:15-31 if necessary)?
Nurture & Apply: the "NA" in DNA stands for Nurture & Apply. These questions are designed to help us care for each other and live out God's word
6. How do you relate to what the disciples are feeling and struggling with in this passage in your own Christian walk?
7. How does Jesus comfort and reassure you when you face these times? How does this passage comfort you now?



### THE PROMISE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Kick-off: before jumping into God's WORD, it's worth taking a few minutes to reflect on your own thoughts and attitudes and on the thoughts and attitudes you encounter in the WORLD...

What would you say if someone asked if you are a "spiritual person"?

Discover: the "D" in DNA stands for DISCOVER. It's now time to read God's word and discover what God wants to teach us and why it matters...



JOHN 14:15-31

- 1. What are your initial reactions to verse 15 (and verse 23)?
- 2. In verse 16, Jesus promises 'another' helper. What does this imply for the disciples?
- 3. What day do you think Jesus is speaking about in verse 20?
- 4. Does Jesus answer Judas' question?

- 5. What insights do we get from verses 16 and 26 about the relationships within the Trinity?
- 6. In verse 27, Jesus says "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you." The early church doesn't face a 'peaceful' road ahead, so what does Jesus mean?

Nurture & Apply: the "NA" in DNA stands for Nurture & Apply. These questions are designed to help us care for each other and live out God's word...

- 7. In verse 17, Jesus says the Spirit will live with (and in) believers. Is this something you think about often? Does the Spirit residing in you impact the way you think, feel, and/or act?
- 8. Jesus makes five promises regarding the coming of the Holy Spirit across John 14-16. Discuss how the Spirit works to achieve these promises in your life and in the life of believers.
  - 14:16 Another Helper, the Spirit of Truth The Holy Spirit helps us to follow and obey Jesus.
  - 14:26 The Teacher The Holy Spirit will teach and remind the disciples (and ultimately us) all that Jesus said.
  - 15:26-27 The Witness The Holy Spirit testifies about Jesus in people's lives and enables us to also testify.
  - 16:7-11 The Prosecutor The Holy Spirit convicts the world of sin, righteousness and judgement.
  - 16:13-15 The Guide The Holy Spirit glorifies the Father by guiding Christians in the truth of the Gospel.

2. How is the relationship between the Father and Son described in this passage (15:23-24, 15:26, 16:15, 16:26-28, 16:33)?

3. According to Jesus, what is the role of the Holy Spirit (15:26-27, 16:7-10, 16:13-15)? How closely linked is the Spirit's ministry to Jesus' ministry?
4. How is what Jesus says here different to: a) How Christians often understand the work of the Spirit?
b) What the world thinks about being "spiritual"?

5. What does it look like for a Christian today to testify about Jesus? How does the Spirit help us in this task?

2. Where does this prayer fit in the storyline of John's gospel? How does this help us understand why Jesus prays for what he does?

- 5. In verses 20-26, Jesus speaks about us being given the glory and love that the Father has given him. Think back to all the descriptions of Jesus' glory and eternal relationship with his Father throughout John what could Jesus mean here?
- 6. Don Carson writes that verse 23 is "breathtakingly extravagant" and that "it is hard to imagine a more compelling evangelistic appeal". How do we communicate to others the extravagance of what Jesus offers here?

JOHN 18:1-19:16

Use character interviews to explore the passage. Nominate a different group member to play the role of Judas, Peter, the Jewish leaders, Pilate and Jesus.

The rest of the group takes turns interviewing each of the characters one at a time. The group reads over the passage and then asks questions like:

- Why did you do that..?
- What did you think when...?
- What did you mean when you said...?
- What's important to you?

The character being interviewed then seeks to answer the question by looking at the bible for the answers. The group can, of course, talk together about the answer where helpful as well. The goal of doing the study this way is to help us get into the story and understand the people and how they experienced the events.

3. Three times Jesus tells Peter to care for his sheep. Why does Jesus keep emphasising that?
4. What does this simple story show us about the character of Jesus?

5. Are there things you've done that get in the way of (or stop) you serving Jesus? How does this story speak into your situation?
